Many Psalms for Many Feelings



Praise, Celebration: Admiring God for who He is and what He has done. Often written for groups. Ex: Psalm 8, 93 and 145



Thanksgiving: Expressing appreciation to God for what He has done. Describing a past problem and the solution. Ex: Psalm 9 and 30



Lament: Brutally honest prayers about dire circumstnaces and appeals to God to intervene. Though at time hopeless, they always move towards God and trust in His character and power to help in times of need. Ex: Psalm 12, 13, and 42



Imprecatory: At times uncomfortable in their emphasis on vengeance, these psalms express honest anger about sin and injustice to God. Pleas to God for his intervention and justice. Ex: Psalm 137 and 139:19-22



Messianic: The psalmists looked towards the coming Messiah who would save the people. They emphasize the king as his coworker. We can praise Jesus for being our savior. Ex: Psalm 2 and 110

DISCUSS TOGETHER

Here are our discipleship questions for this week. Discuss these with your family or friends, or pray about them and think about them on your own, being open to God's response to your prayer.



- Read Psalm 69 and write a Response Prayer.
- Optional icebreaker: What kinds of people make you mad, and what would you like to see happen to them?
- How do imprecatory psalms (psalms that curse others) make you feel?
- Can you think of something that fits this description: the more you use it, the less you need it? How are imprecatory (curse) psalms like that?
- Describe the setting in which you typically have the most honest, unfiltered prayer time with God

OUTDOOR WORSHIP THIS WEEK

Sunday morning at 10:45am those who wish to will gather together in our outdoor courtyard for worship again, weather permitting.

- Please remember to "bring your own everything," especially seating and shade. Check the weather forecast beforehand. A jacket may be advisable, and an umbrella can do double duty as personal shade or shelter in case of an unexpected shower.
- Being outdoors instead of in an enclosed space is intended to reduce the risk of viral spread. As per state and county guidelines, everyone age 2 and up will be required to wear masks and to distance at least six feet from non-household/social bubble members.
- Singing is again a part of our service at this time!
 Please note that per county guidelines we must all keep our masks on while singing, and must maintain distancing.
- We have individually prepackaged communion elements for all those attending, and gluten free bread will be on hand for those who need it.
- If you (or anyone you've had close contact with) have been experiencing any symptoms of illness, you MUST stay home until you and your family members or housemates are completely well again.

For those who choose to remain at home for any reason, we will continue to provide online worship services just like always at 10:45am. The most important thing is that we worship our Lord on Sundays, regardless of the location. Those of our church family who are not joining us at this time will be very greatly missed! We love you all and appreciate your faithful prayers and words of support.

ATTENTION PLEASE!

Let's all comply with current guidelines by wearing our masks properly (fully covering the nose and mouth), keeping at least six feet from all who aren't in our household, and washing our hands/using sanitizer as often as needed.
